Junior Sailing First Session



We did not have the best weather at the beginning of the week, but we still managed a bit of sailing in very light wind. On Tuesday afternoon during the flash flood, we had a chalk talk with all the sailors about wind in the junior sailing room. While some of the sailors already knew about the topics we covered such as, where wind comes from, why it is important to sailors, how it is measured by speed and direction, and the unit of measurements (knots and mph), everyone

learned how to make an anemometer, which measures wind speed. We used dixie cups, pencils and straws, and after we made our anemometers, everyone got to test theirs in front of a fan in order to count the number of spins or revolutions per minute.
