INTRO TO SAILING

The Intro to Sailing program is for beginning sailors with little or no experience.

The sailors will take a swim test in the pool and then practice capsizing an opti, also in the pool. They will learn the parts of the opti and the sail, how to steer and trim the sail.

The ultimate goal is for the sailors to get a taste of sailing and have fun at the same time.
